Vrystaat races to Island

THE speedy South African frigate, Vrystaat, began a mercy dash to lonely Marion Island when it sailed from Port Elizabeth last night at midnight with extra medical resources for a man thought to have acute appendicitis appendicitis.

As the Vrystaat left on the over-900-mile race to the outpost, another warship, the frigate Good Hope, was approaching Port Elizabeth from Mossel Bay to "stand by."

Radio treatment

The name of the sick man was not known last night, but Capt.
J. T. Rabie, of the South African
Medical Corps, said information
about the patient had come
through with the weather reports. He had been under medical super-vision by radio from Cape Town, but apparently was not improv-

but apparently was not improving.

Captain M. R. Terry-Lloyd, commander of the Vrystaat, said that when he reached Marion Island, he would send a motor launch ashore. Whether the doctors treated the sick man ashore, or whether he was brought on board by stretcher, would depend on his condition and the weather.

The Vrystaat will return to Port Elizabeth with or without him as soon as possible. Both the Vrystaat and the Good Hope, which is expected to berth at 6 a.m. today, were paying courtesy calls at Mossel Bay when they were instructed to come to Port
